- 8 Approved electives may be upper or lower division courses from any college on campus, and must be approved by the student's advisor. Developmental courses and EXPH activity courses cannot be counted as electives.
- In order to matriculate to the upper division business curriculum (i.e. Professional Business Core<sup>5</sup>), students must complete the DCOBA Admissions Application to be admitted. Additionally, students must complete all nine (27 semester hours) of the Business Core courses with an overall GPA on those courses of 2.2, and have completed an additional 15 hours in the University Core.
- Economics majors with no concentration electives are FINC options: 3353, 4653, 4733. MGMT options: 3783, 4033, 4113, 4213, 4513, 4613. MIS options: 3113, 3123, 3163, 3203. MKTG options: 3763, 3823, 4143, 4203, 4643, 4723, 4743, 4753. Any 3000-4000 level economics courses can be substituted for FINC, MGMT, MIS, or MKTG options. Economics majors with AGBU concentration electives are a minimum of four (4) AGBU courses (12 hours). Economics majors with a INTB concentration, required electives are ECON 4643, 4723, MGMT 3353 and MKTG 4643. AII ECON majors are additionally required 6 hours of electives in ECON, AGBU or otherwise approved selections. Approved selections for the INTB concentration include any 3000-4000 level ECON or AGBU courses, BUAD 4893, 4993, HIST 3133, 4023, 4643, POLS 3533, 3543, 3553, 3563, 3573,3583, 3593, 3653, 4333, 4653, 4773, 4853, 4983, with study abroad courses, BUAD 4893 and 4993 recommended.

\*NOTE: By completing the **Business Core**<sup>9</sup> courses, the following **University Core**<sup>9</sup> requirements have also been satisfied: Communications, Mathematics, Social & Behavioral Sciences, and Component Area Option – Undergraduate Inquiry & Creativity.
